


# **Student Guide to Homework**

### What does my homework look like at St Peter's?

All subjects will now have a homework sheet that is created for each topic. This will have numerous homework tasks that can be completed. They will follow 'The 3 R's' Model which means they will be based around Retrieval, Reading or Rewarding. Some of these tasks will be compulsory but others are optional.



#### How do I know what pieces of homework to do?

Your class teacher will direct you to the compulsory homework when suitable in your lesson. This will also be added to class-charts.

#### How often do I need to complete homework?

You are expected to complete a minimum of 3 compulsory tasks per half term.

\*\*You can go over and above by completing some of the additional sections of the homework sheet. If you do this and show your teacher then you will earn more achievement points!

## Where can I see my homework for each subject?

On the school website please select 'Curriculum' or 'Students' from the dropdown menu and select homework.

#### Why do we need to do homework?

Homework is important as it allows you to develop and hone important skills, such as time management and discipline. These are skills that you will find invaluable in the near future – including higher education and your work career. It also acts as a way for the teacher, as well as yourself, to realise your current level along with your progress. Homework also helps you to consolidate class work and deepen your knowledge.

## Can I complete my homework at school?

Yes. You can go into the ALC before and after-school every day.
