



Student Guide to Homework



What does my homework look like at St Peter's?

All subjects will now have a homework sheet that is created for each topic. This will have numerous homework tasks that can be completed. They will follow 'The 3 Rs Model' which means they will be based around Retrieval, Reading or a Rewarding task. Your teacher will set you tasks to complete on class-charts.

How do I know what pieces of homework to do?

Your class teacher will direct you to the compulsory homework, when applicable, in your lesson. This will also be added to class-charts.

How often do I need to complete homework?

You are expected to complete a minimum of two compulsory tasks per subject per half term.

You can go over and above by completing some of the additional sections of the homework sheet. If you do this and show your teacher then you will earn more achievement points!

Where can I see my homework for each subject?

On the school website please select 'Curriculum' or 'Student Life' from the dropdown menu and select 'Homework'.

Why do we need to do homework?

Homework is important, as it allows you to develop and hone important skills, such as time management and discipline. These are skills you will find invaluable in the near future – including higher education and your work career. It also acts as a way for the teacher, as well as yourself, to realise your current level, along with your progress. Homework also helps you to consolidate class work and deepen your knowledge.

Can I complete my homework at school?

Yes. You can go into the ALC before and after school every day.

What happens when I do my homework?

Once you submit this to your class teacher, they will award you achievement points and give either written or verbal feedback. These achievement points can then be spent in the class-charts shop along with improving your chance of attending reward trips throughout the year.
